The 2016 Convention in Steven's Point, Wisconsin was a great time! The trip home however was adventurous to say the least!

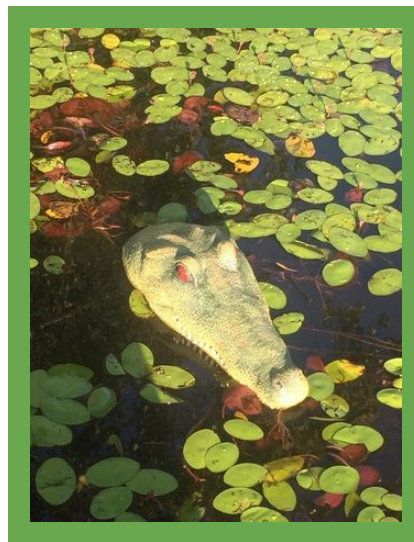
The new storage shed is up and ready
