# History

The Fredericksburg Dog Mart is an annual dog show and event that is reminiscent of the historic first trading that took place in Spotsylvania in 1698 between the Manahoac Tribe and settlers in and around Leaseland, the area that would become the City of Fredericksburg. At the Dog Mart, the Manahoac, Pamunkey, Mattaponi, Patawomeck and Rappahannocks and other local tribes would trade furs, crafts and produce for prized English hunting dogs. The Dog Mart is the oldest recorded dog-centered event of its kind in the United States!

This honorable event continued until the start of the Revolutionary War when it was suspended due to the settler's mistrust of the Native Americans during the fight for independence. It was re-established in 1927 and continued until suspended during World War II. It was revived in 1948 by the Fredericksburg Chamber of Commerce under the auspices of the Fredericksburg-Rappahannock chapter of the Izaak Walton League of America, where it continues to this day.
