will take place this July in Fredericksburg, Virginia. It's a great opportunity to network with fellow Ikes — and do a little sightseeing near the nation's capital.

You'll find the longest stretch of the Appalachian Trail and Shenandoah National Park's Skyline Drive in Virginia. If you're a Civil War buff, don't miss Chancellorsville Battlefield (where Stonewall Jackson was mortally wounded by his own troops) and Wilderness Battlefield (where Generals Grant and Lee met).

From voting on conservation policies to electing national leaders, the convention is critical to charting the course for the League. YOUTH CONVENTION







The Fredericksburg-Rappahannock Chapter and Youth Convention Committee created a fun schedule filled with conservation enrichment. Here's a peek at the schedule.

TUESDAY: Early Bird pizza party followed by a swim in the hotel pool.

WEDNESDAY: Travel to **Westmoreland State Park** to go hunting for ancient shark teeth and enjoy watersports and other nature activities along the Potomac River. The park is an excellent site for spotting bald eagles, ospreys, kingfishers, great blue herons, and more. Westmoreland has a Discovery Center as well as hiking trails, including a new beach trail that offers a stunning view of the Potomac River. End the day with a sweet treat at **Westmoreland Berry Farm**.

THURSDAY: Start the day with a trip to the **Chancellorsville Battlefield** to learn about the Civil War and identify environmental changes due to the battle fought here. After lunch, visit the **National Museum of the Marine Corps**, where you'll be transported to the beach at Iwo Jima, a frigid winter night in Korea, and a hot landing zone in Vietnam. Exhibits include the original flag raised on Iwo Jima.

FRIDAY: After attending the morning session of the national convention, spend the

day at the **Fredericksburg-Rappahannock Chapter** fly fishing, building bird boxes, and more, including a cookout and an evening with the native snakes of Virginia.
